The Festival of Forest



Van Mahotsav is a yearly celebration which was begun by Kulapati Kanaiyalal Munshi Ji popularly known by his pen name Ghanshyam Vyas, the Union Minister for Agriculture to make excitement among the majority for woods preservation and planting trees. It is presently a seven days length celebration.

During this celebration, a large number of trees are planted all over India. It was begun to make mindfulness in the psyche of the individuals for the protection of timberlands and the planting of new trees. Van Mahotsava is commended as a celebration of life. In India, it was begun as a campaign to save mother earth.

The name Van Mahotsava signifies 'the celebration of trees'. It started in July 1947 after a thriving tree planting drive was embraced in Delhi, in which public pioneers like Dr. Rajendra Prasad and Jawaharlal Nehru took an interest. The celebration was all the while celebrated in various states in India. From that point forward, a great many saplings of assorted species are planted with the vivacious investment of local people and different organizations like the Department of Forests & Wildlife.

By urging Indians to help tree planting and tending, celebration coordinators want to make a greener nation. It would give elective energies, expand the creation of food assets, make cover belts around fields to build profitability, give food and shade to steers, offer shade and ornamental scenes, diminishing dry spell, and assisting with forestalling soil disintegration.

The principal seven day stretch of July is the perfect time for planting trees in many parts of India since it matches with the storm. Founder of Bhartiya Vidya Bhawan Sh. K.M Munshi is known as the father of Van Mahotsav as indicated by 'Duat lai lawmlai Lalduhawma' of



On the occasion of 75 years of Independence, Amrit Mahotsav is being celebrated nationwide. Under this, the initiative of MAGIC Mela proposes the plantation of 75,000 number saplings within city area.

Shri Banwarilal Purohit, Hon'ble Governor of Punjab & the Administrator, UT Chandigarh honoured the inauguration with his benign presence as the Chief Guest. Sh. Debendra Dalai, CCF informed that the department has planned to plant 75 different tree species of medicinal value of 75 numbers each and this Amrut Van has been designed in such a way that it will bloom all throughout the year as per flowering season of the particular plant.
